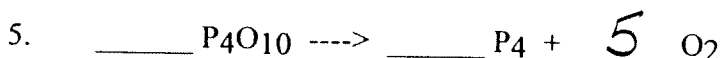
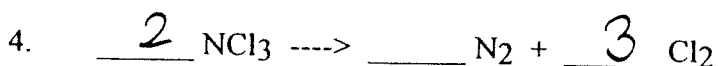
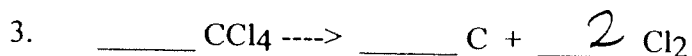
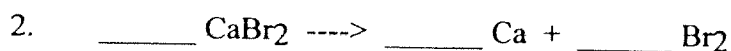
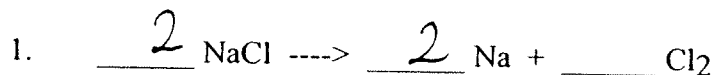
- To predict the product, you must join the two reactants together.

10. 2 Zn + O_2 ----- > 2 ZnO

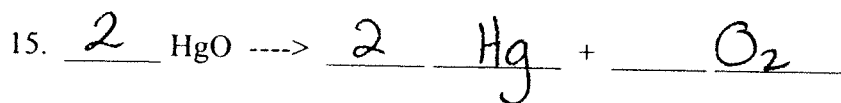
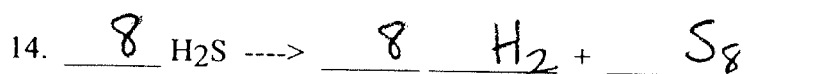
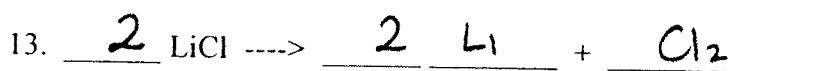
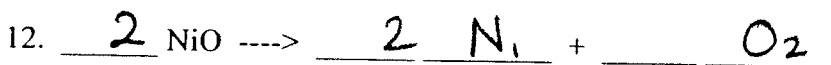
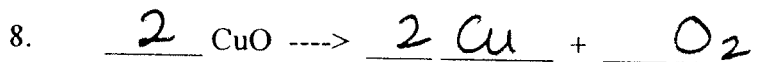
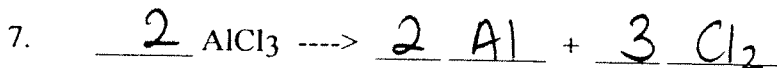
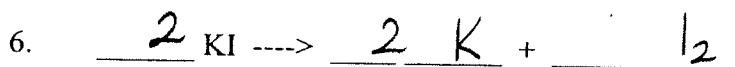
